The Collaboration for Evidence, Research and Impact in Public Health (CERIPH) in the Curtin School of Population Health is looking for talented and experienced health promotion and public health people to join our pool of research and evaluation staff.

CERIPH is a multi-disciplinary research group located at Curtin University in Perth, Western Australia. Our mission is to seek solutions that promote health, prevent disease and protect populations from harm.

CERIPH began as the Western Australian Centre for Health Promotion Research. It was established in 1986 and was the first health promotion research centre in the southern hemisphere. For more than 35 years the centre has sought to undertake applied and real-world research and evaluation and delivered a range of capacity building activities to support health promotion action. We have contributed to the establishment and development of key health promotion and public health programs and policies in WA, nationally and globally.

Currently, we are completing research projects across areas including: mental health, sexual and reproductive health, sexuality, infectious diseases, non-communicable conditions, physical activity, use of alcohol or other drugs, tobacco control, housing, education, gambling, health service access, migration and population mobility and injury prevention. From time-to-time CERIPH requires staff for a range of short and longer-term research and/or evaluation projects. Successful applicants will be required to work with staff across a range of CERIPH projects. Tasks will vary and may include: literature reviews, ethics applications, administrative support, project management, research proposals, development and delivery of training, website and social media content, co-supervision of student project and volunteers, organising events and meetings, writing reports, qualitative and quantitative data collection, instrument development and analysis, conference abstracts and presentations, grant writing, writing publications for peer review, and community and policy knowledge translation.

Requirements of applicant

1. Relevant qualifications, preferably in health, humanities or social sciences
2. Expertise in health promotion, public health, evaluation and/or research
3. Ability to work independently and to use initiative in problem solving
4. Demonstrated ability to work in a team
5. Highly effective verbal and written communication skills
6. Demonstrated ability to liaise effectively with industry collaborators
8. Experience with qualitative and/or quantitative data collection methods and analyses

Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, applicants must have the ability to work from home as required with access to telephone and high-speed internet.

Expressions of Interest should be provided in the form of a one-page cover letter and current CV that outlines your suitability against the above requirements.
